## Executive Director Update

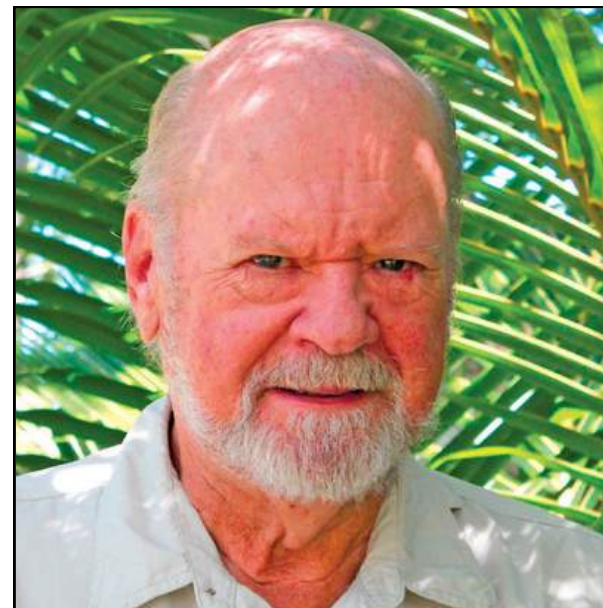
Greetings, Friends of CREW!

As we transition into 2026, we can all look back with pride at what we – staff, volunteers & members – were collectively able to accomplish in 2025.

Advancing CREW Trust's mission to protect and steward the water resources of the Corkscrew Regional Ecosystem Watershed (CREW) takes many forms, including educational programming, community engagement, and promotion of compatible, sustainable public use. It's all designed to cultivate generations of stakeholders who understand CREW's importance and are both equipped and inspired to care for these vital lands now and in the years ahead.

As many of you know by now, we recently lost a giant in conservation, Ed Carlson, who passed away in mid-December. Although he is perhaps best known for his contributions at Audubon's Corkscrew Swamp Sanctuary over a career that lasted more than a half century, he was also instrumental in the launch of the CREW Project in 1986 and the founding of CREW Trust just a few years later. In fact, Ed served on the CREW Trust board from 1989 until 2019, including 13 years on our Executive Committee and five years as Board Chairman (2005-2010).

As a young man, Ed Carlson helped build the boardwalk at the Sanctuary that tens of thousands of adults and children enjoy each year as they learn about the value of our local ecosystems and natural communities. He knew perhaps better than anyone that the work we accomplish today will reverberate for generations to come. As the ancient Greek proverb reminds us: *"A society grows great when old men plant trees under whose shade they know they shall never sit."*

## Trail Operations

### Trails Are Dry and Ready to Enjoy

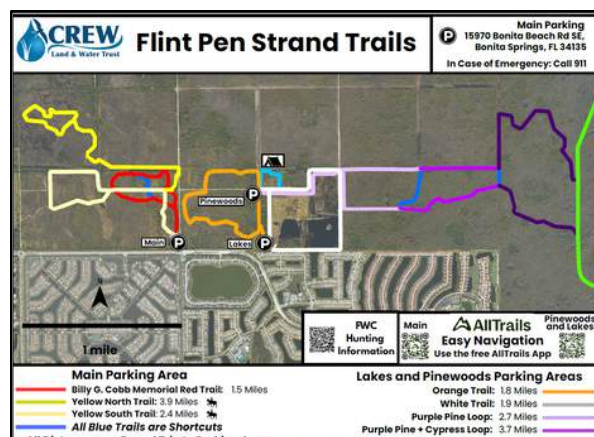
The Trail Work Tuesday team has been hard at work making their way around CREW, visiting each trail to prepare for the transition to the dry season! The trails have been mowed, lopped, re-marked, and readied for your enjoyment. Trail conditions are updated monthly on our website, FaceBook, Instagram, and on extension 0 when you call the CREW Trust office number (239-637-2253).

### New Trail Maps Published

Be sure to check out the new trail maps published this fall! Each trail system map features a beautiful trail photo on the front of the brochure. The maps have been updated with a new satellite base layer, standardized formatting and symbols, QR codes for AllTrails maps and hunting information, as well as more accurate trail length information. The back of each map has been redesigned with information about the trails, the CREW watershed, CREW Trust, events and programs, and how to get involved. ### Summer Wet Walks Made a Big Splash

During the recent wet season, CREW Trust offered wet walks on the CREW Trails, offering guests an opportunity to get their feet wet, experience the beauty of the trails in summer, and learn about the watershed and its flora and fauna - with opportunities for dip netting and soil sampling along the way. At CREW Cypress Dome Trails, participants enjoyed a full tour of representative CREW ecosystems, exploring a marsh, cypress dome, and popash slough. We also discussed pine uplands around us, as well as the oak hammocks and ecotone transition zones in between. At CREW Flint Pen Strand Trails, we hiked the first loop of the purple trail, visiting the marsh, the Kehl Canal, and exploring hydric pine flatwoods spotted with cypress and various carnivorous plants.





## Trail Operations, Cont'd

### Volunteer Program Stats

From July to December 2025, CREW Trust volunteers logged over 2,500 volunteer hours! This includes time spent maintaining trails, guiding hikes, conducting wildlife surveys, assisting with research, helping with education programs, and so much more!

### New Volunteering Opportunity: Willow Wednesday

Although it is a native species, Carolina willow (*Salix caroliniana*) can become a “nuisance species” when it forms dense stands in marshes. When this happens, it can reduce biodiversity and disrupt water flow and hydroperiods. Interested in helping us remove nuisance willow from our small marshes at the CREW Cypress Dome Trails and CREW Marsh Trails this dry season? ### New Picnic area at CREW Flint Pen Strand Trails

The Trail Work Tuesday team created a new picnic area this summer at the pond off Harrell Road, seen on your left as you drive towards the Pinewoods Parking Area. The area around this beautiful pond has been cleaned up and a picnic table installed. This is a great spot to have lunch with friends or family, read a book, hydrate while hiking, watch the birds, and simply sit and enjoy nature.

### Upcoming CREW Herpetofauna (Reptiles and Amphibians) Study

The Trail Work Tuesday team helped Florida Gulf Coast University researchers install study plots for a 2026 herp study at CREW. This study will assess herp biodiversity at nine sites across CREW Cypress Domes and CREW Marsh Trails. This study duplicates research done 15 and 30 years ago and aims to learn about recent changes in herp biodiversity at CREW.

## Education Programming

### Walk Through A Watershed

Our education team recently completed another season of *Walk Through a Watershed* in support of Collier County Public Schools. Almost 400 third grade students came out to CREW Marsh Trails during October and November to participate in this program. The students began the day learning the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates; next, they embarked on a hike discovering flowering and non-flowering plants. They ended the trip learning about water quality by dip netting near Suzanne's pavilion. We are excited to begin preparing for the second grade field trips in the coming weeks!

### High School Programs

Along with all our elementary school field trips, we also hosted several high school students this fall. Lee County's STEM @ Work program visited CREW Cypress Dome Trails for a program focused on habitat differences in our watershed. Four biology classes from Aubrey Rogers High School visited CREW Cypress Dome Trails to learn what it takes to be an Ecologist: investigating soil types, discovering microhabitats, and learning vegetation monitoring skills.

### Adult Programs

We have officially started another season of adult programming with a diverse range of topics, including *Bug Watch* - an interactive insect identification hike led by entomologist Constance Darrisaw, and *The Secret Lives of Panthers and Bobcats* - a hike led by Mark Lotz, a panther biologist with FWC. Coming up in the spring we will offer *Edible and Medicinal Plants*, which completely sold out last year, and *Invasive Plants of Southwest Florida*, led by Rick Bauer the CREW Science Supervisor for the South Florida Water Management District, as well as multiple programs for kids including *Life in a Log*, and *Herpetology for Kids*. As always, we will also be offering our regular guided hikes and monthly guided birding walks. ## Education Programming, Cont'd

### University Programs

The summer and fall semesters at FGCU have come and gone! Colloquium, a class focused on sustainability and the challenges of integrating people, profit, and the planet in sustainable development, continues to visit CREW Marsh Trails and CREW Flint Pen Strand Trails as part of their field trip rotation. On these field trips, students hike the trails and discuss how water travels through our watershed and the role CREW plays in enhancing groundwater supply, water quality and stormwater control. We also welcomed two Environmental Geology classes out to the trails this fall to learn about soil composition, aquifers, and groundwater flow. We are looking forward to welcoming FGCU students back to the trails during the upcoming semester!

### Community Science

An important part of environmental education is data collection and monitoring the state of CREW's ecosystems. This fall, we held our bi-annual *Butterfly Count* with Connie Nagele at CREW Flint Pen Strand Trails. We recorded 294 butterflies representing 22 different species. The spring *Butterfly Count* is open for registration on Eventbrite now! Piper also completed the 2025 frog and toad surveys for FWC - this survey ran from June - September. Amphibians are an indicator species, meaning their presence and/or absence can tell us a lot about the health of an ecosystem; so, studying these species at CREW is crucial.

### In-Town Lectures

Our summer in-town lecture series was a huge success! We had some amazing topics: *Eat the Weeds in your Backyard*, *Exploring CREW's Fern Diversity*, *Understanding Mosquitoes in our Ecosystem*, *Frogs: Canaries in our Wetlands*, *The Splendid and the Vile (Parasites)*, and *From Aquifer to Tap*, all presented by experts in each field and hosted at venues throughout Lee and Collier Counties. We are already looking forward to planning the Summer 2026 In-Town Lecture Series - reach out if you have any topic suggestions!

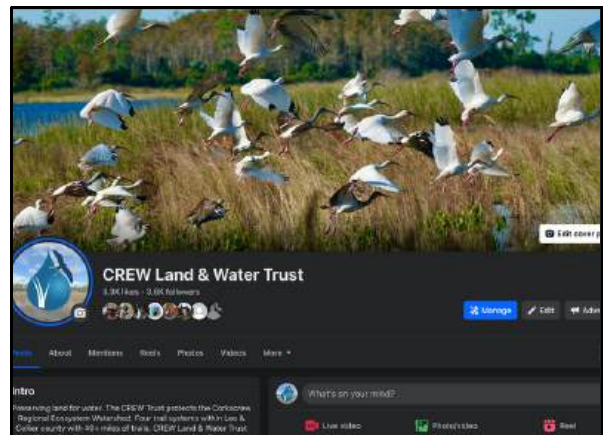

# Closure at CREW Bird Rookery Swamp Trail

## Temporary Closure at CREW Bird Rookery Swamp Trail

As you may have heard, the boardwalk and parking lot at CREW Bird Rookery Swamp Trail has been closed since December 12<sup>th</sup>. We had hoped these facilities would remain open until February, when the rebuild of the boardwalk and expansion of the parking lot are scheduled to begin; however, recent inspections indicated several potential safety concerns. Consequently, the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) directed the immediate closure of the boardwalk. It and the parking will remain closed throughout the duration of construction to ensure public safety and allow for the installation of additional visitor amenities when the site reopens.

The infrastructure improvements at CREW Bird Rookery Swamp Trail are planned to begin in early February with completion projected to occur by Fall 2026. These include a complete rebuild of the 1400' boardwalk, which will improve long-term durability, safety, and environmental protection, ensuring CREW Bird Rookery Swamp Trail can be enjoyed by future generations. The parking lot will also be expanded to include several additional spaces. Additionally, pre-cast CTX concrete vault toilets will also be installed at the parking area. These improvements, budgeted at more than \$1.5 million, reflect the SFWMD's continued commitment to protecting South Florida's natural resources while enhancing compatible public access and recreation. The SFWMD has expressed appreciation for the public's patience and cooperation as these exciting improvements are made.

We know the boardwalk closure during season will come as a disappointment to those who love CREW Bird Rookery Swamp Trail as much as we do, but the safety of visitors is paramount. The good news is that the tram trail itself remains open and can be accessed via the Purple Trail at CREW Flint Pen Strand Trails, located off Bonita Beach Road. This is also a great time to explore CREW's other three trail systems!

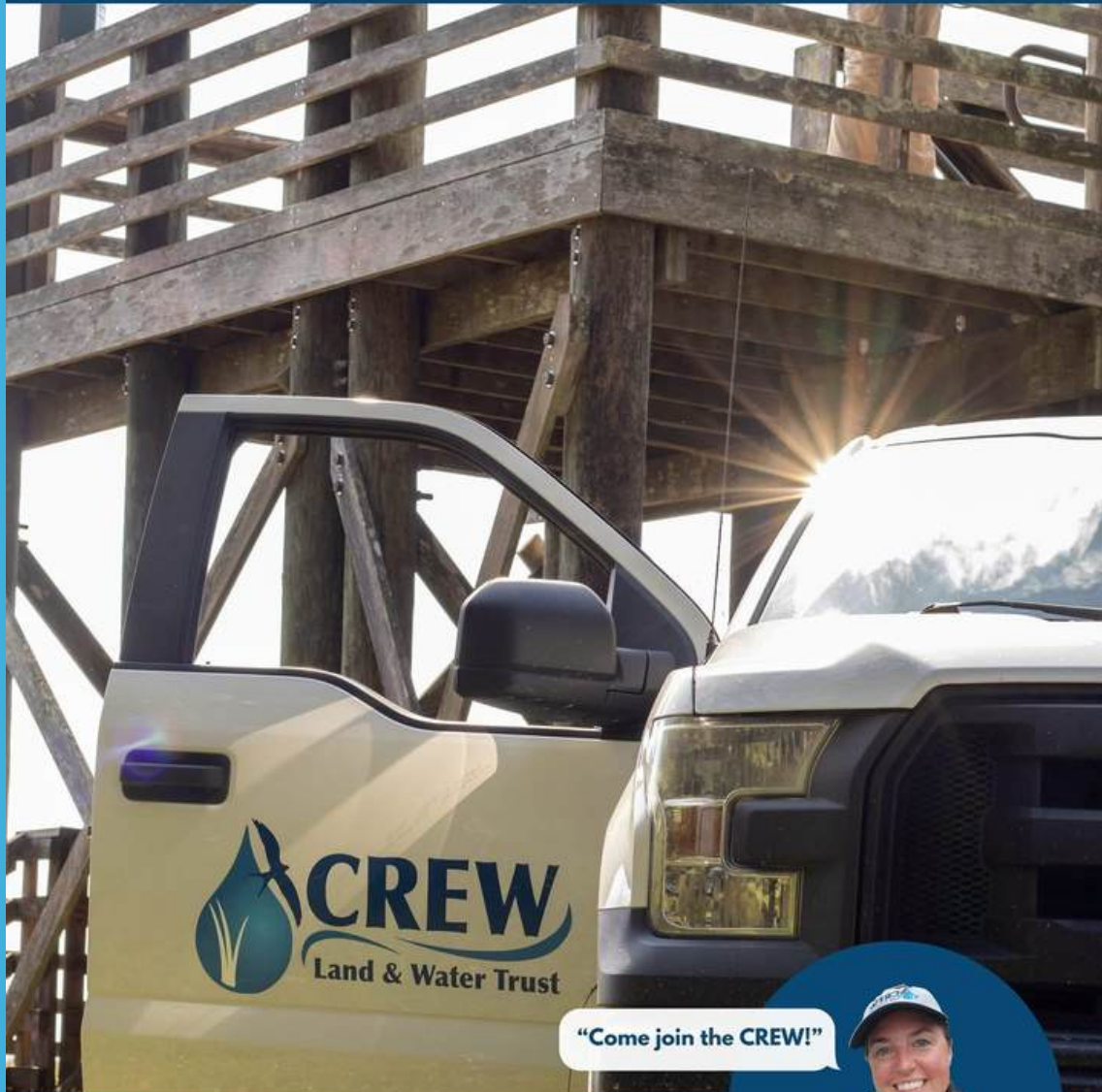
